Why are Veterans Homeless?

- Extreme shortage of affordable housing
- Poor physical health and disabilities
- Mental illness and substance abuse
- Lack of employment and difficulty of skills transfer
- Lack of family and social support networks

The Harbor's Response to Veterans' Needs

- ⇒ **Housing:** 2-year transitional housing and permanent housing placement
- ⇒ **Physical Health:** 3 nutritional meals a day and referrals to physicians and hospitals
- ⇒ **Substance Abuse & Mental Health:** Only licensed recovery home for people with HIV/AIDS in Lake County
- ⇒ **Employment:** Occupational therapy, GED tutoring, individualized service plan
- ⇒ **Supportive Community:** Caring staff and peers, Spiritual Care and After Care programs



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
